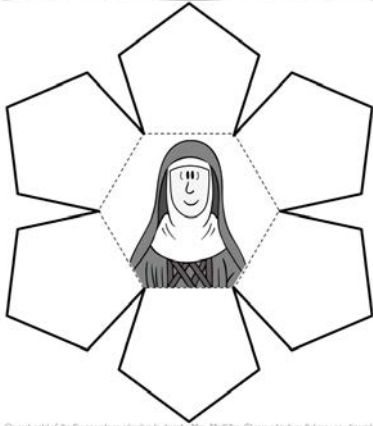




Australia's Female Pioneers

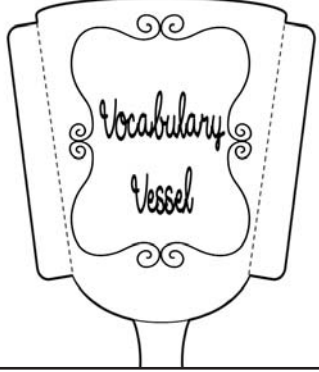


Mary Mackillop

Where was Mary Mackillop born? Who were her parents and how many children did they have?

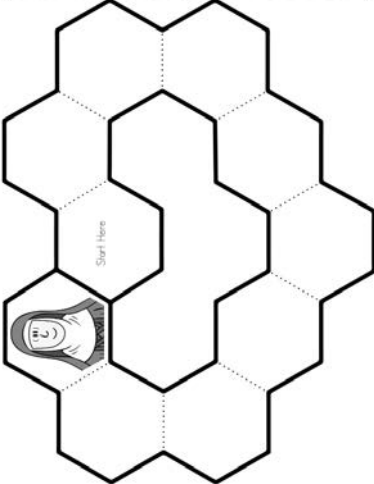
