
Federation Agamograph

ASSEMBLY INSTRUCTIONS





Agamograph Instructions



Step 1

Colour-in each section of the agamograph. Make sure that you use the correct colours on the alternating sections for each picture.



Step 2

Carefully cut around the outer edge of the the image.



Step 3

Carefully fold along each line creating a sharp crease. Take your time and try to get your folds right on the line. Don't worry about creating an accordion fold yet. Run your finger along each crease to make it nice and sharp.



Step 4

Once you have folded along each line re-fold your agamograph using the same lines but turning the page each time to create an accordion or fan. Start by folding the edge section **inwards** as shown here.

Step 5

Your agamograph should now look like this. If you turn it side to side you can start to see how it will look when it's finished.



Step 6

Once you have folded your agamograph spread glue on the back of the last strip on one side only.



Step 7

Carefully glue this section to the edge of the border on your background as shown here and smooth it down. Line up the edge of the paper with the black border.



Step 8

Repeat this step on the other side carefully lining up the edges again to keep it straight.

Congratulations! Your agamograph is now ready to display.


